New bishop named for South Carolina diocese

In Rome, by Archb preparing (1985–19 Order of S Pope Benedict XVI named Robert E. Guglielmone, 63, to be the new bishop of the diocese of Charelston, S.C. The diocese has been without a bishop since Bishop Robert Baker moved to the diocese of Birmingham, Ala., in October 2007.

Guglielmone, who was ordained a priest in 1978, has spent most of his ministry in New York, where he was most recently the rector at St. Agnes Cathedral in Rockville Centre, N.Y.

As the 13th bishop in the diocese, Guglielmone will shepherd nearly 200,000 Catholics, which make up about 4 percent of the state's population. He will be installed as bishop March 25 at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist in Charleston.
